

**SUPREME COURT TO
TAKE RECESS TODAY**

**Two Important Opinions May
Be Handed Down Before
Summer Vacation.**

With its docket cleared of all submitted cases, the Supreme Court will begin its summer recess today and will not reconvene for the fall term until Monday, September 29.

It is expected that an unusually large number of opinions will be handed down today, the most important of which probably will be the one relating to the contempt proceedings in the Lawrence Circuit Court in which Senator Clyde Going and others are involved, and one affecting the validity of the act of the recent legislature creating the Village Creek and White River Levee district in Jackson and Woodruff counties.

The Going case grew out of the two trials of Wolf Benningfield before Judge R. E. Jeffery at Walnut Ridge for the murder of John Bagley. Clyde Going of Harisburg and L. B. Poindexter were attorneys for Benningfield. At the first trial, in which the jury failed to agree, it was charged that Going enticed a juror named Mosely, accompanied by Joe Frier, the court bailiff, to go to his room to take a drink. As the result Going, Poindexter, Mosely and Frier each were cited for contempt of court and each was fined \$50 and sentenced to five days in jail by Judge Jeffery. The case was taken to the Supreme court on a writ of certiorari and will be decided today.
